if = whether
"if you want (it or not)."
"whether they like it or not."

What's the difference?

IF	WHETHER
one use of <i>if</i> : conditional sentences	one use of <i>whether</i> : to show choices or possibilities
EXAMPLES If it rains, we will cancel the picnic. If it rained, you'd get wet. If it had rained, we would have stayed inside.	EXAMPLES We'll have the picnic <i>whether</i> it rains or not. I'll be happy <i>whether</i> it's rainy or sunny! <i>Whether</i> it rains or shines, I prefer to be outside.
Sometimes, <i>if</i> and <i>whether</i> can be used interchangeably.	
I don't know <i>if</i> it rained here on Sunday. I was out of town all weekend.	I don't know <i>whether or not</i> it rained here on Sunday. I was out of town all weekend.

is it not?

She **plays** well, **doesn't she?**
does she not?

You **ve** done your homework, **haven't you?**
have you not?

No contractions (more formal)

"You **can** speak French, **can't you?**"

"You **will** do your homework, **won't you?**"

"You **don't** have problems, **do you?**"

"She **is** happy, **isn't she?**"

"You **have** a son, **don't you?**"

"You **are** happy, **aren't you?**"

"She **is** happy, **isn't she?**"

"She **is not** happy, **is she?**"

"He **eats** chocolate, **doesn't he?**"

"He **doesn't** eat chocolate, **does he?**"
